The Open Net Foundation Cross Ice Hockey Tournament Rules

- Games consist of two twelve minute periods. Players will switch ends after the first period.
- There will be four teams with approx. 8 players on each team. Every two minutes the horn will sound for a line change. Younger players (7's & 8's) will alternate with older players (9's & 10's).
- Gold, Silver, Bronze, and consolation medals will be awarded
- Games are 4-on-4, with NO goaltenders.
- Players not playing on the current shift will gather in the neutral zone while they wait for their next shift.
- No team entries. Players will be divided based on ability to make even team as best we can. Take the opportunity to make some new friends.
- Small nets will be utilized and a crease will be marked around each goal. No players are allowed in the crease from either team. If the referees determines that entering the crease impacted the play he has the option to whistle the play dead and call for a face off.
- All players will play two games. The winners of the first two games will play for the Gold medal. The losers of the first two games will play for the Bronze medal.
